The Society for Information Science (SIS) awards SIS Fellowship every year to honor and recognize outstanding contributions in the area of information science and technology, and Young Information Scientist Award (instituted in 1989 in the memory of Late Shri A.S. Raizada, eminent information scientist and founder Secretary of SIS).

**SIS Fellowship Awards for the year 2016**: Nominations were invited for SIS Fellowship and for Young Information Scientist Awards for the year 2016. Nominations were made by the Professors, Heads of the Departments, Institutional Heads,

- Self-nominations or nominations without bio-data were not considered.
- In the case of Young Information Scientist Award, the age of the nominee was **not more than 35 years as on the closing date.**
- Nominations reaching to the Secretary SIS by the last date, along with signed hard copies with complete bio-data of the nominee, including his/her contributions to the field specifically to the area of Information Science were considered.

The Expert Committee identified by the EC members, have made their recommendations. This year only SIS Fellowship is being given to Dr Manoj Kumar Patairiya, in recognition of his numerous and wide ranging contributions to the growth and spread of the niche domain of science media and S&T Policy studies, an imminent Science Communicator and information professional. Additionally, SIS recognizes his role in establishing science and technology based public outreach programmes using mass-media, notably TV and

popular writings. The committee could not find any suitable candidate for the award of Young Information Scientist. Dr Patairiya will be honored during the Conference at Kolkata.
